River loop walk from Rivermead to Sandford-Upon-Thames

Plans are progressing to formalise a walking route from Rivermead Nature Park through to Sandford-Upon-Thames, creating a new high quality 6 km loop on both sides of the river, via Iffley and Sandford locks.

There has been an unofficial path from Rivermead to Heyford Hill Lane for some time, which has in the past attracted fly tipping and rough sleeping, but recent work by GoodGym has cleared the litter and widened the path.

From Rivermead Nature Park, the route runs under the ring road bridge, through some woodland, to a grassy unused vehicle track.

Following this track for a short way, the route then turns right along another section of woodland path, reaching Heyford Hill Lane.

We are now encouraging as many people to walk the route as possible, in order to increase footfall and naturally improve the footpath.
